

Course outcome of Philosophy

Cc-01 Indian Epistemology -

Indian epistemology investigates knowledge sources, validity, and cognition through traditional theories like perception, inference, and testimony, shaping philosophical thought.

Cc -02 Contemporary Indian Philosophy

To enhance the students to understand the contemporary issues of the present society like religion, humanity, prosperity, social justice.

Cc -03 Ancient Greek, Medieval and Modern Philosophy -

The course explores key ideas from ancient Greek, medieval, and modern philosophy, tracing the evolution of thought and critical analysis.

Cc-04 Indian and Western ethics

The course examines Indian and Western ethics, comparing moral theories and values. It explores key concepts like duty, virtue, and justice, analyzing how cultural contexts shape ethical decision-making and philosophical debates.

Cc -05-Western Logic

Cc-06 Western Epistemology

Cc -12 Indian Logic

Cc -13 Philosophy of Religion

The course on philosophy of religion explores arguments for and against the existence of deities, the nature of faith and reason, and ethical implications of religious beliefs, fostering critical and reflective thinking.
